**“WE’RE WATCHED 24/7!”**

The Shepherd King and song writer, David, was aware of The Eye watching him. He said, “O LORD, You have searched me and known me. You know my sitting down and my rising up; You understand my thought afar off.” (Psalm 139:1-2) The awareness of an All-Seeing-Eye will chill some, calm others; scare some, sober and/or satisfy others depending upon our relationship to the One Who sees all.

If we know Him as our heavenly Father Who watches in care over His own, we are comforted.
